Dear Friends,



We Our Volunteers!

- Our amazing barn volunteers put in over 3000 volunteer hours in 2024!
- 111 individual barn volunteers & 2 office volunteers

According to the Independent Sector Value of Volunteer Time for the state of Illinois is \$30.97 per hour, which means our volunteers gifted us the equivalent of almost \$93,000!

Walk On hosted Carol Wilson to give a Centered Riding Clinic in March. Carol also did a TTouch session with our volunteers!

















